
2022 Graduating Senior Survey: Fast Facts

Overall Satisfaction



- 96% rate the quality of the overall education they received as "excellent" (55%) or "good" (40%)
- 91% said they would recommend NC State to a friend
- 84% would choose to attend NC State again


NC State's Ability to Meet Students' Needs

Academic and Personal Growth

Students are most likely to report that NC State contributed "very much" to their development in the following areas:





- Gathering relevant information or evidence (68%)
- Applying analytic skills (65%)
- Ability to plan and carry out projects independently (63%)

Personal development goals:



- Seeing projects through to completion (68%)
- Taking responsibility for my own behavior (67%)
- Valuing learning as a lifelong process (64%)

World view goals:




- Ability to work with people from diverse backgrounds (64%)
- Understanding and respecting diverse cultures, values, and perspectives (60%)

Engagement in High-Impact Experiences*




- Paid internship: 47%
- Unpaid internship: 23%
- Research/scholarly/ creative project with a faculty member: 22%

NC State Students Persevere



- 1/4 of respondents said it took over four years to graduate, most often due to changing majors, participation in a co-op or internship, or for personal or financial reasons
 1/4 of respondents who had graduated say they
- ¼ of respondents who had graduated say they had considered withdrawing or transferring from NC State, often to pursue a different major, for personal or health reasons, or due to the Covid-19 Pandemic

Survey Methodology

The Graduating Senior Survey is administered every academic year to a population of students who expect to graduate in that academic year. In 2022, of the 5,608 students invited to participate in the survey; 3,221 students did so, for a response rate of 57%.
