

North Carolina State University 2013 Incoming Transfer Survey: Open-Ended Comment Coding Scheme

The Incoming Transfer Survey now includes two open-end questions, asking students 1) what they are most excited about in coming to NC State; and 2) what they are most concerned or nervous about in starting their first semester of college. Verbatim comments for each question were grouped into different categories by topic. (A single comment could be included in multiple categories.) The different categories for the Incoming Transfer Survey open-ended comments are listed alphabetically below.

Adapting to NC State (e.g., *Adapting to college lifestyle, Experiencing new things/a "fresh start", Navigating campus, Finding classes, Leaving one's hometown*)
