2017 Transfer Student Survey:

Open-Ended Comment Coding Scheme

The Incoming Transfer Student Survey includes two open-end questions, asking students 1) what they are most excited about in coming to NC State; and 2) what they are most concerned or nervous about in starting their first semester of college. Verbatim comments for each question were grouped into different categories by topic. (A single comment could be included in multiple categories.) The different categories for the Incoming Transfer Student Survey open-ended comments are listed alphabetically below.

Campus Life/Involvement (e.g., Student organizations, Club sports, Arts/Theater, Campus events, ACC athletics, etc.)
