## **2021 Incoming Transfer Student Survey: Open-Ended Comment Coding Scheme**

The Incoming Transfer Student Survey includes two open-end questions asking students 1) what they are most excited about in coming to NC State; and 2) what they are most concerned or nervous about in starting their first semester at NC State. Verbatim comments for each question were grouped into different categories by topic. (A single comment could be included in multiple categories.) The different categories for open-end comments are listed alphabetically below.
