



Fall 2010 preliminary enrollments were taken on census on August 31 from SIS. Official enrollments will be finalized by October 15. Race / ethnicity tables show 2008 counts in the old definitions, 2009 and later use the new definition mandated by IPEDS and UNC-GA.

The new definition added the Native Hawaiian group and allows selection of more than one race.

All enrollment tables are sum of on-campus and distance education students.

Internal transfers are based on undergraduate students who were enrolled a year ago (on fall census) in a different college.

About 85% to 90% of all distance education SCHs are supported by state funds under current funding policies.
