

Dec 2019 Undergraduate Future Plans Survey College of Education Summary Report

This report presents summary results from the Dec 2019 Undergraduate Future Plans Survey for departments in the College of Education, followed by summary information on employment and further education for the college as a whole.

Highlights for the College of Education

- 60% of seniors in CED graduating in fall 2019 responded to the survey
- 33% of respondents in CED said they had obtained a full-time position by graduation
- 100% of CED graduates with full-time employment said they would be working in North Carolina (100% in the Research Triangle Area)
- 33% of respondents in CED indicated they were planning to go to graduate/professional school in the year after graduation

Department Summaries

The following table provides summary statistics for Dec 2019 graduates in each of the College of Education departments. It includes the number of students in the department who graduated in Dec 2019 and the number of those students who submitted the Undergraduate Future Plans Survey. It also includes the number of students who indicated that at the time of the survey they had already accepted a full-time position (including military and volunteer work [e.g., Peace Corps]), and the number who indicated they were either attending or planning on attending graduate or professional school in the coming year. Finally, it includes summary statistics on the self-reported salaries of those having accepted full-time employment.
